**Word Limit:** Maximum 200 words (The name of the presenter must be underlined).

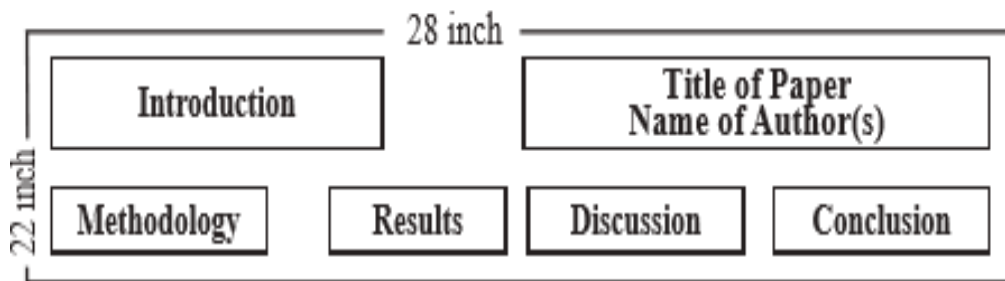

- Authors:** Times New Roman 12 pt, bold, alignment left, single-spacing. Order: Last Name, First Name Initial(s).
- Text:** Times New Roman 12pt, Justified, Single-spacing comprises Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion.
- References:** According to the APA style.

#### 2. Best Paper Award IPSC-2019 (Please mention this at the top of your paper):

Only empirical, original and single author papers are invited from the scholars of up to 40 years (as of 10 September 2019) of age to present their paper in a special session during the conference. A self-declaration mentioning that the paper is ever never presented or published before is to be submitted.

The screening committee will select 5 (five) research papers for this purpose. The rest are to be presented in their respective scientific session. The winner will be announced and felicitated with cash prize of Rs. 1100/- with certificate at valedictory.

### **3. Young Scientific Award IPSC-2019 (Please mention this at the top of your paper):**

Only the scholars of up to **35 years of age** (as of 10 September 2019) can compete for this award. All remaining conditions and felicitation will be the same as mentioned above for Best Paper Award.

**Note:** Compete for only one award, even if you are eligible for both. Mention your respective category to compete at the top of your paper.
